



Idiosyncratic features, such as sculpted green planters and a matrix of digital lights set within green walls add character to the extraordinary setting. After dark, the composition of lit and unlit features sits comfortably together to create a new unmissable experience - a calm sanctuary that is a welcome counterpoint to the bright lights of the city.


