



Sam studied at the Arts University College Bournemouth where he gained both a National Diploma in Art and Design and a first class honours degree in Architecture, winning the Terence O'Rourke prize for his final project. He was nominated for a RIBA Bronze Presidents Medal Prize and shortlisted for the TTJ Timber Innovation Award. He also won the Architects Journal's Standout Student Award in 2012.
